### <u>Meditation Practice</u>

With the seemingly endless winter season and the subsequent lack of social events it affords us, there is an apparent sense of melancholy and woe. The grey and the gloom weigh heavy on us, even as the hours of daylight extend and we look toward spring. It's easy to feel down, to feel overwhelmed, to feel stuck. And when I feel those things, I find that there are a few things that help ground me.

In recent weeks, I've been leaning into breathwork. The exercise which I find to be most effective is breathing coupled with counting. As I begin, I take notice of my breath—discerning if it is fast or slow, deep or shallow, how it reflects my thoughts and feelings. I follow that noticing with a few deep breaths into my belly, as slowly as I can manage them so as to calm my nervous system and clear my mind. Then, I start counting. I count as fast or as slow as I like, however long I choose. I inhale and exhale at the rate that feels right for my body with this deliberate practice. The counting gives me agency in a world that is out of control and the breath gives me a kind of healing release.

### Self-Care Challenge

The pressure of a new year and of the resolutions we made at its start, it isn't uncommon to feel like we aren't enough. It's easy to feel like we've already failed or like we aren't meeting our goals. But, we are constantly navigating the ups and downs of life, taking each obstacle as it comes, and doing our best to cope with an ever-changing world— in an election year, no less!

Our self-care challenge this month is to give ourselves affirmations; to remind ourselves of the things we are, the things we do well, and the things about which we are proud. You can speak them to yourself in the mirror, you can write them down in a journal or on post-it notes that you can stick somewhere special, or you can whisper them in your heart. Whatever you choose, be kind and gentle with yourself. You're doing the best you can and it will be okay.


