- 2.) Be more present

- 4.) Take time to rest
- 5.) Give others the benefit of the doubt; assume good intentions
- 6.) Voice my gratitude more freely
- 7.) Play/listen to more music
- 8.) Let go of things that are toxic to my wellbeing or no longer serve me
- 9.) Share more
- 10.) Create

If these resolutions— I'm going to call them opportunities— speak to you, I invite you to join me in them. If these opportunities feel too overwhelming for where you are right now, and you can't even fathom taking them on, that's fine too. If one or two of these opportunities resonate with you, lean in and see what happens. This is just the beginning of a new chapter in the ever-unfolding mystery of life.

<u>Meditation Practice</u>

Having just experienced the joyful chaos of Christmas and the holiday season, I find myself feeling wound up and unsettled. And although my body is exhausted from all of the running around and now-complete to-do lists, my mind is still racing and refuses to rest. This isn't necessarily unfamiliar to me— my neuro-divergent mind is never really still— but it feels more draining this time around. And so I find myself in a position where I feel inspired to meditate but when I try to do so, it's near impossible.

So, rather than trying to quiet the noise and clear my mind, I've decided to dig in to it. As a result, I find myself asking these questions of my thoughts: 1.) what thought is the loudest? 2.) what does it want from me? 3.) am I able to fulfill that task right now? 4.) what does it mean?

I know it seems silly to literally address the noise in your head but I've found that, by doing so, I take away some of the power this noise has over me. I'm able to meet my needs more easily and to find moments of focus and clarity along the way. If you find yourself in the same mental/emotional space as me, give it a try.

Self-Care Challenge

I don't know about you, but the holiday season feels like a weird, liminal space where there are no rules, there is no structure, and where time is not real. Christmas cookies and cream-cheese based dips are the staple of my diet and there is no rhyme or reason to my sleep schedule. I feel dysregulated and like I need some smelling salts or a swift kick in the hiney to pull me out of it. I need some semblance of routine or I will truly make my full descent into madness.

And I find that the most helpful thing to do when faced with this reality is to listen more attentively to my body— to follow the internal rhythms of my mind, body, and spirit. I make a point of eating when I feel hungry (not when I feel bored or anxious or when I feel it's somehow appropriate), moving my body if and when it feels right, and resting when I feel tired. And I do this, even if it goes against the schedule that is expected. It's the only way meet myself where I am and to regulate the systems of my body on their own terms. I know it's hard, but I hope you'll consider it as our self-care challenge this month. Who knows— it may change your life for the better.
